

More Observations on the Ouran's Mathematical Structure

One of the unique properties of the Quran's miracle based on the number 19 is the mathematical coding of the occurrence of certain words. For example, the word "God" (Allah) occurs in the Quran 2698 times, or 19 x 142. Furthermore, the numbers of the verses where the word "God" occurs add up to 118123, or 19 x 6217. There are many other examples. Please refer to the Appendix of the English translation of the Ouran by Dr. Rashad Khalifa for further details.

In this article, we will present to you some of the observations made by brother Saeed Talari from New Hampshire, regarding the statements "Elaahun Waahidun" (One god), and "Allah Wahdahu" (God alone).

"Elaahun Waahidun" (One god)

The statement "Elaahun Waahidun" (One god) is repeated the Ouran eleven times in ten different chapters. Based where this statement occurs in these chapters, these mathema ical observations follow:

1. The sum of the sura and the verse numbers where the statement occurs, plus the number of times the statement repeated yields:

$149 + 809 + 11 = 969 (19 \times 51)$

2. Instead of adding the above numbers, if you write them sid by side to make an 8-digit number, you get:

$149\ 809\ 11 = 19\ x\ 788469$

3. When you add the numbers of the suras that have initial letters, the result is:

$2 + 14 + 41 = 57 (19 \times 3)$

4. Adding the value of the initials, plus the number of sur involved, plus the number of initial letters in these suras giv you:

$350 + 3 + 8 = 361 (19 \times 19)$

5. Finally, if you add the sura and the verse numbers where this statement is found, plus the value of the initials, and the number of initialed suras which contain the statement "Elaahun Waahidun," you get:

$149 + 809 + 350 + 3 = 1311 (19 \times 69)$
